Background	Choice of background is appropriate and clear. All slides communicate the message clearly.	Background is mostly appropriate. Some slides detract from message. Amount of Text	Followed the 6X6 rule on every slide and used minimal text according to the standard.	Mostly followed the 6X6 rule, but some slides were covered in text.	Hardly followed the 6X6 rule, and most slides were covered with text	Did not follow the 6X6 rule and all slides were covered in text.
Delivery	Presented the material with confidence, kept the audience motivated, and did not rely on notes/text.	Presented the material with confidence and was able to keep the audience motivated, but relied too much on notes/text.	Presented the material with some level of confidence, but struggled with keeping the audience motivated and depended largely on notes/text.	Seemed unfamiliar with the content, failed to present with confidence, and did not motivate the audience. Completely dependent on notes/text.

PowerPoint Presentation Checklist:

- Do you have at least 5 slides? Will your presentation be at least 5 minutes in length?
 - Did you prepare an interactive study guide for your audience to follow your and use throughout your presentation?
 - Is the background color/theme appropriate? Does the background support the message of the presentation? Are graphics/images and text clear against it?
 - Are the images used supporting the message of the presentation? Are they meaningful? Appropriate? Impacting? Are the images clear and sized suitably? Are you using thought-provoking images to enhance the learning experience for your audience?
 - Does the font style coordinate with your message? Can your audience see it? Does the color choice support your presentation? Did you consider the emotional/situational impact of the font?
 - Does your presentation adhere to the 6X6 rule? (No more than 6 words across, no more than 6 lines down...if you are using text)
 - Are you familiar with your content enough to deliver the presentation with confidence? Are you an expert on your topic? (think eye-contact, passion, poise etc.)
 - Is your presentation one that you would want to listen to? Will it make your audience think? Did you think about your audience's attention span?
- Optional Considerations You Might Want To Explore:**
- Add an "grabber" to pull your audience into your topic
 - Create a **RELATIVE** "exercise" or "activity" to keep your audience motivated (i.e. draw a hotdog)
 - Include video clips
